#### A Member's Story

My name is Jimmy C. and I am an alcoholic. My sobriety date is November 07, 2021. I am sober today by the grace of my Higher Power and the program of Alcoholics Anonymous.

I grew up in a relatively "normal" household. My alcoholism I inherited alcoholism from my father. I inherited fear from my mother. My dad was a full-blown drunk, even though he had a great job. My mom also had a great job and we relied on her paychecks to pay for all the bills and everything else. My father spent his checks on the drink. I have an older sister who was the favorite child. I never understood why she got everything she wanted and, if I was lucky, I got whatever was left. I have never felt "good enough" and it probably stemmed from that experience.

Watching my dad drink himself into oblivion everyday was like watching a falling star, but it was my favorite star. I started to believe that if I could hold a steady job, that would mean I had earned the right to drink. Drink until I passed out and transformed into a deranged and depraved human. I held onto that belief for many years.

As I grew older, my maternal grandmother became very ill. She was the only person who really showed me love and protected me as best as she could. I became her caregiver at the age of 14. That's when my drinking started. Three years later, my grandmother died in my arms. This was the beginning of the end for me. I began to drink like an alcoholic who only had a week to live.

By the time I reached my 20's, I was drinking to die. I'd had a very unhealthy romance with death since my youth and I just wanted to die. I grew an immense hatred towards the idea of God and religion. I became a solidified blasphemer. I also started the vicious road of codependency and depression. All of the things that made me the perfect candidate for a disastrous partner. I fell in love with someone on Facebook and eventually moved to Hawaii to live with her. She had been sobering since 2000 and I did not care one bit to be supportive or respectful of that huge accomplishment. Our relationship moved fast and on Halloween of 2011, our daughter Lily was born. She was the first baby born on Halloween in Honolulu, HI in 2011. That child was, and is, my entire world. I knew I had to stop drinking for her. But I couldn't. I felt subhuman. King Alcohol had its stranglehold on me.

By 2020, I had burned my life into the ground. I had everything I had ever wanted and I was still actively trying to drink myself to death. I had suicidal thoughts every day from 2012 until March of 2020. On March 22, 2020 I attended my first AA meeting. It was a newcomer's meeting at New Phoenix Group. I did not go to detox or rehab. I was not on paper, but I was dying of alcoholism. I was well acquainted with the hideous Four Horsemen – Terror, Bewilderment, Frustration, and Despair. I attended a meeting every day for two weeks. Then Covid hit and meetings moved to the Zoom platform. I had no desire to drink. My daughter Lily had already been diagnosed with multiple autoimmune disorders so I did not want to venture into public because I could potentially bring something home that could kill my daughter. Things were turning around, or so I thought. The woman I had fallen in love with in 2010 was warning me about relapsing but I thought she was full of it. She was right.

In October of 2021, I pushed my girlfriend away and into the arms of another. I felt I had done no wrong and that I was done with life. I made the conscious decision that I was going to attempt to drink myself to death one last time. After being "dry" for 19 months, I crawled back to hell with my master, King Alcohol. On November 5, 2021 I purchased enough to surely put me out of my misery. I consumed everything I had purchased and I did not die. I was face to face with the Pale Horse Named Death and I was terrified. That was my Step One and Spiritual Experience. I reached out to the only AA member whose number I had saved and asked for help.

I came back to New Phoenix on November 7, 2021 and detoxed there again. Since that day, I have worked the program of Alcoholics Anonymous to the best of my ability. I have lost close friends, pets, my last maternal aunt, and have not had to pick up a drink. I've had several emotional bottoms and have not had to pick up a drink. I am currently working the 12 Steps again with my second sponsor and stay involved in service work. I have a Higher Power who I pray to and depend on. I haven't had a sobriety threatening issue since I came back but I have had life threatening issues. My depression is still present so I'm one of the ones with grave emotional and mental disorders, but I have the capacity to be honest. Today I have a life that I don't want to run from. Every good thing that has happened to me in the last three years is a direct result of working the AA program. Today, I choose to live!


